

Sunny Carrel

The PPSC Artisan's Guild announces their 2005 workshop, "Buckets and Brushes," an exceptional Digital artwork class with Award Winning digital artist Sunny Carrel. The class will be held in conjunction with the Lamarr Williamson School of Photography, February 9-13, 2005.

At this dynamic workshop, first you will learn digital artwork methods for portrait retouching and enhancement in Photoshop, then the class will progress into Corel's Painter 9, where your electronic creativity will soar as you master digital brushes, watercolors, pastels, and natural media paints.

Familiarity with Photoshop is required; however no prior experience with Painter is necessary. Together we will explore some of the areas that were previously the domain of the airbrush, the oils and the pencils and dyes of the traditional artists. Your digital tools are an extension of your mind and talent, and this class will teach you how to use these tools to their best advantage in an artistic manner. You will amaze yourself at the beautiful painting you will master!

Sunny Carrel, FPH, Coastal Director PPSC, and President of the PPSC Artisan's Guild, has won many awards for her digital images including several of the Fuji Masterpiece Awards and the Kodak Gallery Awards. She has held the title "Photographer of the Year" from the South Carolina Professional Photographers Association. Her images have hung at Epcot as a part of the Kodak Gallery Exhibition, and for the past four years her images have been featured in "Loan Collection," the prestigious collection of exception images recognized by the Professional Photographers Association of America.

Classes will start at noon on Sunday and run till noon on Thursday.

Workshop requirements are as follows:

Photoshop 7.01 or higher

Painter 9

At least 256 MB Ram. Photoshop and Painter are memory grabbers...dedicate at least 80% of your memory (after the memory needed for your operating system) to each program. We will not have both programs open at the same time so this should be sufficient.

CD drive and media for file storage/transfer.

Plenty of hard drive space...clean up your computer before the class.

Monitor capable of millions of colors.

Wacom Pen Tool such as the Intuos 2, 6x8. THIS IS ESSENTIAL!
